- A different group of high school students will visit Bay City and connect with one of Calvary's former Pastoral Residents, Marco Salazar, and his new church plant, Radiant Church. They will assist Marco and Radiant Church in their current ministry as well as spread the love of Jesus in the community.

More than anything, these students need our prayer support. 
