weekly focus: mozambique update

Jesus had compassion for the people of Chinhangane, Mozambique because they were like sheep without a shepherd. God showed me the people of Chinhangne. They were poor, hungry, uneducated and in need of spiritual teaching. I asked God to give them food, to give them a way to support their families, to give them good spiritual leaders and to give them hope and to help them. Most of all to show them that God loves them, cares for them and wants a personal relationship with them.

God said **YOU** give them these things. "How can I do that?" I ask God, "The problems are so great and I have so little to offer." "What do you have?" God asked. "Do you have a few weeks' time? Do you have friends and family who can pray for you and support you financially? Do you have the ability to memorize a few stories from the Bible, tell them to the people of Chinhangne and help them to explore what they mean? Do you have it in your heart to come alongside a missionary family who have dedicated their lives to helping these people and encourage them? Can you play games with children? Can you fix things or show others how to maintain them?"

I responded, "Yes, I can do those things." So God called a few others who felt like I do and he took our meager talents and he poured out His Holy Spirit on us and blessed us. He brought us to Chinhangane and had us live among the people for a week (our Short-Term Mission trip). He had us tell them that God loves them and cares for them. He had us demonstrate His love by being with the people and encouraging them. He had us comfort Lucky and Sonnet who had an extremely difficult year. When we left we could see a few glimpses of hope in the village, but I wondered if we had really accomplished anything. I asked God why he hadn't multiplied our efforts the way he multiplied the five loaves and two fish. Why didn't more people accept Jesus as their Savior? God said, "I did. You are forgetting that what you are doing is not just for today but for eternity and you cannot see eternity, today. If you could, you would see the people who are in heaven for eternity because of the seeds you planted, the people who are in heaven because of what you did to encourage Lucky and Sonnet to keep on ministering to the people when they felt they couldn't go on any longer. You would see people in heaven who live to be adults rather than dying as children because they had food to eat. What you saw was just a glimpse of what I did through your time in the village."
